NOTICE OF JOINT HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to the City of Berwyn Code of Ordinances, sections 801 and 804, (the "Code") and Section 7-5 of the Liquor Control Act of 1934 (235 ILCS 5/7-5 (West 2007)) (the "Act"), a joint hearing will be held before the City of Berwyn Licensing Officer and Local Liquor Commissioner at the Berwyn City Hall, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, located at 6700 W. 26th St, Berwyn, Illinois on **June 9, 2026 at 1:30pm** in connection with proceedings to revoke the City of Berwyn liquor license and business license issued to the Licensee, commonly known as Mike's Place Sports Bar & Grill (the "Licensee") for the Premises located at 6319 W. Roosevelt Rd. , Berwyn, Illinois (the "Premises"), based upon the following:

INTRODUCTION

1. Pursuant to Part Eight, Title Two, Section 804 ("Section 804") of the Code and the provisions of Act, the City issued a liquor license to the Licensee, which is located at the Premises.
2. Pursuant to Section 804 of the Code and the provisions of the Act, no licensee shall violate any local, state or federal law on the Premises.
3. Pursuant to Part Eight, Title Two, Section 801 of the Code, the City issued a Business License to the Licensee.
4. Pursuant to Chapter 804 of the Code, liquor licenses issued under the provisions of the Code may be revoked for cause by Liquor Control Commissioner for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or any state law pertaining to the sale of alcoholic beverages. If, upon a determination in writing, under oath, that the continued operation of the licensed premises would constitute a clear and present danger to the health, safety or welfare of the residents of the city, the Commissioner may order the immediate closing of the licensed premises pending a hearing on the charges, which hearing shall be held not later than 72 hours after the issuance of the immediate closing order. *See* Berwyn Code of ordinances; Section 804.21 LICENSE SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION; HEARINGS as set forth below.

§ 804.21 LICENSE SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION; HEARINGS.

(A) The Liquor Control Commissioner may suspend, for not more than 30 days, or revoke for cause any license issued under this chapter for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or any state law pertaining to the sale of alcoholic beverages. If, upon a determination in writing, under oath, that the continued operation of the licensed premises would constitute a clear and present danger to the health, safety or welfare of the residents of the city, the Commissioner may order the immediate closing of the licensed premises pending a hearing on the charges, which hearing shall be held not later than 72 hours after the issuance of the immediate closing order.

5. Pursuant to Part Eight, Title Two, Section 801 of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances (the "Code"), the City of Berwyn also had previously issued a Business License to the Licensee for 2026.

6. Pursuant to Chapter 801 of the Code, a Business License issued under the provisions of the Code may also be revoked for cause by City Licensing Officer for a violation of any of the provisions of this chapter or any state law. If, upon a determination in writing, under oath, it is found that (1) When the conduct of any licensee or agent or employee thereof is so inimical to the public health, safety and general welfare as to constitute a nuisance and thus give rise to an emergency, the City License Officer may summarily order the cessation of the business and the closure of the premises, or may suspend or revoke the license therefor, said authority set forth in Chapter 801 of the Code as set forth below;

§ 801.12 ENFORCEMENT; Subsection (D) Summary action.

(1) When the conduct of any licensee or agent or employee thereof is so inimical to the public health, safety and general welfare as to constitute a nuisance and thus give rise to an emergency, the City License Officer may summarily order the cessation of the business and the closure of the premises, or may suspend or revoke the license.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, BATTERY, FAILURE TO REPORT, NO REGISTERED MANAGER ON DUTY AT THE PREMISES: 23 MAY 2026

7. On or about May 23, 2026, at approximately 1:30AM, Oak Park Police witnessed an altercation in the street between patrons exiting the establishment. The altercation began verbally and progressed into a violent physical fight between two females in full presence of the police with numerous onlookers and participants. Police and Mike's security members had to physically intervene to break up the fight and protect the combatants from injury. The entire incident is captured on Oak Park Police body camera. When Berwyn Police arrived, they spoke to Kevin Buford who falsely identified himself as the owner of Mike's Place. Buford failed to report the incident occurred between patrons of Mike's Place and directed the police a block away to Roosevelt and Highland. Mike's Place security guards are seen in the video actively involved in the disturbance as it starts in front of the establishment and continues down the block. Berwyn **police report 26-04503**. Oak Park CAD report and video.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, LARGE UNRULY CROWD
AT THE PREMISES: 19 APRIL 2026

8. On or about April 19, 2026, at 2:05AM, police responded to Mike's Place for a rowdy street disturbance involving more than 75 people who were yelling, blocking the street, and participating in erratic and dangerous behaviors. The crowd became hostile and refused to disperse resulting in an all call for every police officer from Berwyn and Oak Park to respond and diffuse the situation. Documented and recorded on body camera under **police report 26-03401**.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, BATTERY TO BARTENDER, CRIMINAL
DAMAGE TO PROPERTY
AT THE PREMISES: 17 APRIL 2026

9. On or about April 17, 2026, at approximately 11:19PM, police responded to Mike's Place for criminal damage to vehicles. Upon arrival, police learned that a female patron had become involved with a bartender and battered her with pepper spray. Upon being ejected from the premises, the offender committed criminal damage to vehicles parked outside the premises. The incident involves violation of Illinois criminal law statutes, including Battery, Criminal Damage to Property, and Disturbance of the Peace. Criminal complaints to be signed. Berwyn Police **report 26-03365** and Oak Park Police **report 26-01903**.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, BATTERY
AT THE PREMISES: 29 MARCH 2026

10. On or about March 29, 2026, at approximately 10:23PM, police responded to Mike's Place for a battery that just occurred inside the premises. Victim reports being the victim of a battery by two offenders inside the premises before offending parties were forced to leave. The incident represents a violation of Illinois criminal law statutes, including Battery and Disturbance of the Peace. Criminal complaints to be signed. **Police report 26-02692**.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, LARGE UNRULY CROWD
AT THE PREMISES: 28 MARCH 2026

11. On or about March 28, 2026, at approximately 1:50AM police responded to Mike's Place for a disturbance involving a large crowd. Multiple Berwyn Police, Oak Park Police, and approximately 10 security guards from Mike's Place were needed to disperse the crowd. **Police report 26-02661**.

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, LARGE CROWD OBSTRUCTING TRAFFIC, NO
MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 21 MARCH 2026

12. On or about March 21, 2026, at approximately 02:08AM, police responded to Mike's Place for numerous cars and people obstructing the roadway in front of the premises. Police met with Shawn Grubbs who identified himself as the manager but is not registered with the city in

that capacity. Police dispersed the crowd and documented under **report 26-02439** along with local ordinance citation C2180-0000025 for no registered manager on duty.

FALSE FIRE ALARM- MANUAL PULL, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 15 MARCH 2026

13. On or about March 15, 2026, at approximately 10:33PM, police and fire units responded to Mike's Place for a manual pull station activation on the fire alarm. Fire units inspected the premises and found no active fire and determined that the alarm had been manually pulled in violation of 720 ILCS 5/26-1. The police were unable to locate anyone who admitted to being the manager on duty at the time. **Police report 26-02233.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 25 FEBRUARY 2026

14. On or about February 25, 2026, at approximately 1:17AM, police responded to a fight in progress at Mike's Place. Upon arrival, they spoke with Kevin Buford who identified himself as the manager but is not registered as a manager with the City of Berwyn. Buford indicated that individuals were yelling and threatening bar staff. Offenders left prior to police arrival. **Police report 26-01662.**

DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 15 FEBRUARY 2026

15. On or about February 15, 2026, at approximately 9:12PM, police responded to an apparent domestic disturbance at Mike's Place. Upon arrival, police witnessed a large line in front of the premises and spoke with the doorman/security guard who indicated that a verbal disturbance occurred, but the parties left prior to police arrival. Police were unable to speak with anyone who identified themselves as a manager. **Police report 26-01383.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, BATTERY, RESISTING A PEACE OFFICER, NO
MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 7 FEBRUARY 2026

16. On or about February 7, 2026, police responded to Mike's Place for a female attacking the security guard. A subject identifying himself as the manager, Shawn Grubbs, directed police to the rear of a nearby Uber vehicle where the backseat passenger was positively identified as the offender. The offender refused to exit the vehicle and struggled with police who took her into custody. Complaints signed and case sent to court. No such manager is on file with the licensee. **Police report 26-01103.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 31 JANUARY 2026

17. On or about January 31, 2026, at 02:07AM, police responded to Mike's Place for a 9-1-1 call with an open line and people screaming in the background. Upon arrival, police met with

Shawn Grubbs who identified himself as the manager and denied that any disturbance occurred. No such manager is on file with the licensee. **Police report 26-0864.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, BATTERY, PERSON WITH A GUN, UNLAWFUL USE OF A WEAPON, NO MANAGER ON DUTY AT THE PREMISES: 18 JANUARY 2026

18. On or about January 18, 2026, police officers made on-view contact with a disturbance at Mike's Place. Upon arrival, police learned from Mike's security that a female at the location had battered security and is in possession of a firearm. Police detained the subject and recovered a loaded 9MM Canik MC9 handgun. Police did not make contact with any manager. Witnesses gave statements that the offender pulled out a gun during the encounter. **Police report 26-00510.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, BATTERY AT THE PREMISES, NO MANAGER ON DUTY AT THE PREMISES: 14 JANUARY 2026

19. On or about January 14, 2026, police responded for a disturbance with a battery victim at Mike's Place. Upon arrival, the female victim reported being battered by another female patron whom she knows from previous interactions. A subject named Kevin Buford identified himself as the manager, but no such person is listed as a manager on the licensee's liquor license application. **Police report 26-00367.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, LARGE UNRULY CROWD, MOB ACTION, NO MANAGER ON DUTY AT THE PREMISES: 10 JANUARY 2026

20. On or about January 10, 2026, at 1:34AM, police responded to a large fight in progress in front of Mike's Place. Upon arrival, police observed approximately 200 people in the street yelling and making threats and gestures at each other. Numerous police officers were needed to disperse the unruly crowd and subject named Kevin Buford identified himself as the manager. No such person is listed as a manager with the licensee liquor file. **Police report 26-00246.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, UNLAWFUL USE OF WEAPON AT THE PREMISES: 04 JANUARY 2026

21. On or about January 4, 2026, at approximately 01:55AM, police responded to Mikes Pace for a large disturbance involving 20 or more patrons fighting in the street in front of the establishment and someone pointing a firearm. Upon arrival, people on scene directed the police to a vehicle fleeing the scene at a high rate of speed. Police stopped that vehicle and located a loaded semi-automatic handgun. Large crowd dispersed by multiple police officers. **Police report 26-00083.**

BATTERY AT THE PREMISES AT THE PREMISES: 29 NOVEMBER 2025

22. On or about November 29, 2025, police were dispatched to 155 E. Brush Hill Rd., Elmhurst, IL 60126 in reference to a battery that occurred at Mike's Place. The female victim stated she was battered coming out of a bathroom stall by a female suspect who struck her with a closed fist approximately five to six times. No other calls were received from any Mike's Place employees regarding the incident. Victim stated Mike's Place security observed the altercation and removed suspect as a result. **Police report 25-10121.**

ALLEGATION OF UNDERAGE PATRONS, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 16 NOVEMBER 2025

23. On or about November 16, 2025, at approximately 11:40PM police responded to Mike's Place for a report of underage patrons. Police met with Shawn Grubbs who identified himself as the manager but is not registered with the city in that capacity. Grubbs stated they recently removed a female who used a fake ID from the premises. Security was using ID scanners, and no underage individuals were allowed in the bar. **Police report 25-09648.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, UNWANTED PARTY
AT THE PREMISES: 1 NOVEMBER 2025

24. On or about November 1, 2025, police responded to Mike's Place for a disturbance by a belligerent patron who refused to leave. The female was identified by security and was escorted from the premises. **Police report 25-09190.**

NO MANAGER ON DUTY, AMBULANCE ASSISTANCE
AT THE PREMISES: 12 OCTOBER 2025

25. On or about October 12, 2025, police were dispatched for an ambulance assistance call at Mike's Place for a patron that felt faint. Shawn Grubbs, who identified himself as the manager, was on the premises and provided the bar's business license and liquor license. No such person is listed as a manager with the licensee liquor file. **Police report 25-08546.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, UNRULY CROWD
AT THE PREMISES: 5 OCTOBER 2025

26. On or about October 5, 2025, police responded to a call about a large group of people who exited Mike's place and currently yelling on the 1200 block of Cuyler Avenue. Upon arrival, officers observed a crowd of people congregated around several vehicles. Police lights were activated and the crowd dispersed and left. **Police report 25-08273.**

BATTERY, DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, RESISTING A PEACE OFFICER, NO
MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 30 JULY 2025

27. On or about July 30, 2025, police responded to a call about a disturbance at Mike's Place. Shawn Grubbs and Kevin Buford identified themselves as the managers, however, they are not registered with the city in that capacity. They stated a female offender was climbing on speakers and talking belligerently before she was removed from the premises. While being escorted out, the offender swung and struck three security guards. Upon investigating, the female offender was arrested and charged with 3 counts of battery and 1 count of resisting a peace officer. An additional male offender was charged with 1 count of obstruction of a peace officer and 1 count of resisting a peace officer. **Police report 25-06124.**

VIOLATION OF ORDER OF PROTECTION
AT THE PREMISES: 7 MAY 2025

28. On or about May 7, 2025, police responded to a call at Mike's Place from a female who stated her ex-boyfriend was violating an order of protection. The order was found to be active, and the ex-boyfriend was identified and complied with requests to exit. **Police report 25-03518.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 30 APRIL 2025

29. On or about April 30, 2025, police responded to a call about a disturbance at Mike's Place for two male and two female patrons throwing drinks at one another. Upon arrival, no such disturbance was occurring. Kevin Buford confirmed no disturbance had occurred. Buford is not a registered manager at the bar. **Police report 25-03306.**

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 29 MARCH 2025

30. On or about March 29, 2025, police responded to a call from a security guard at Mike's Place regarding an assault. The security guard stated the male offender attempted to enter the bar but was denied entry due to his intoxication level. The male became belligerent and tried to force his way inside before stating he was going to his vehicle to grab his firearm to shoot the security guard. The manager on duty, identified as Matthew Roberson, gave a description of the male who was found and placed in custody. Roberson is not a registered manager at the bar. **Police report 25-02343.**

DISTURANCE OF THE PEACE, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT THE PREMISES: 26 MARCH 2025

31. On or about March 26, 2025, police were dispatched to Mike's Place regarding a group of females arguing and fighting in front of the bar. Kevin Buford identified himself as the manager and stated the females left the scene prior to the officer's arrival. No such manager is on file with the licensee. **Police report 25-02266.**

AMBULANCE ASSISTANCE, NO MANAGER ON DUTY
AT PREMISES: 9 MARCH 2025

32. On or about March 9, 2025, at approximately 1:04AM police responded to a report of an intoxicated male at Mike's Place. The manager on scene, Matt Roberson, stated the male was acting odd before he was escorted outside and was able to say he needed an ambulance. The man was loaded into the ambulance and taken to a nearby hospital. No such manager is on file with the licensee. **Police report 25-01749.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE
AT THE PREMISES: 9 MARCH 2025

33. On or about March 9, 2025, at approximately 10:40PM police responded to a disturbance call. The caller stated a group of females were verbally arguing in front of Mike's Place. The owner, Michael Lapinard, stated the group left the scene prior to the officer's arrival. **Police report 25-01763.**

DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE
AT THE PREMISES: 1 MARCH 2025

34. On or about March 1, 2025, police responded to a call about a disturbance regarding four females jumping on the caller's car. The caller stated she was at a party at Mike's Place when a verbal altercation occurred between her and another female she knows personally. Mike's security kicked the other female out. The caller began walking to her car shortly after and the female offender was waiting for her with friends and started to jump on the hood of her car. Officers only received a 9-1-1 call from the victim and not from Mike's Place itself. **Police report 25-01527.**

PRIOR HISTORY OF MISCONDUCT BY LICENCEE AND PRIOR CLOSURES AND
LICENCE SUSPENSIONS FOR VIOLATIONS OF BERWYN ORDINANCES

35. On or about May 13, 2021, the Licensee appeared before the Liquor Commissioner on a series of violations involving noise disturbances, violent street fights, parking problems, and various other violations of the Liquor License. Following that hearing, the Commissioner found the establishment liable, and the Licensee received a two-week suspension of the Liquor License and submitted a business plan pledging to make changes to the operation of the business.

36. On or about March 27, 2023, the Licensee again appeared before the Liquor Commissioner for violations of the Liquor License to include providing nude/semi-nude exotic dancers and solicitation of prostitution. Following that hearing, the Commissioner found the establishment liable, and the Licensee received a 4-day suspension.

COUNT I
CONDUCTING BUSINESS WITHOUT A QUALIFIED MANAGER OR AGENT ON
PREMISES IN VIOLATION OF CHAPTER 804, SECTION 804.14(K) OF THE
CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN.

37. The City restates and realleges those allegations set forth above in paragraphs 1-34 and incorporates the same as paragraphs 1 through 34 of this Count I.

38. The Licensee, on one or more occasions, caused or allowed the premises to be unlawfully operated by failing to personally supervise the sale of alcohol or to have an authorized manager on site as required by the conditions of being issued a liquor license set forth under Section 804.14(K) of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn. Said violations occurred on or about the following date(s): 05/23/26, 03/21/26, 03/15/26, 02/25/26, 02/15/26, 02/07/26, 01/31/26, 01/18/26, 01/14/26, 01/10/26, 11/16/25, 10/12/25, 07/30/25, 04/30/25, 03/29/25, 03/26/25, 03/09/25.

COUNT II
DISORDERLY CONDUCT IN VIOLATION OF CHAPTER 666, SECTION 666.06 OF
THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN.

39. The City restates and realleges those allegations set forth above in paragraphs 1-34 and incorporates the same as paragraphs 1 through 34 of this Count II.

40. The Licensee, on one or more occasions, caused or allowed the violation of several subsections of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances, to wit: Chapter 666, section 666.06 entitled DISORDERLY CONDUCT in that both loud verbal and violent physical altercations occurred as set forth in paragraphs 1 through 33 above occurred at the Premises in violation of Chapter 666 of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances. Said violations created an endangerment to the public and occurred on or about the following date(s): 05/23/26, 04/19/26, 04/17/26, 03/29/26, 03/28/26, 03/21/26, 02/25/26, 02/15/26, 02/07/26, 01/31/26, 01/18/26, 01/14/26, 01/10/26, 01/04/26, 11/01/25, 10/05/25, 07/30/25, 04/30/25, 03/26/25, 03/09/25, 03/01/25.

COUNT III
USING THE PREMISES TO DISTURB THE PEACE IN VIOLATION OF CHAPTER
666, SECTION 666.01 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF
BERWYN.

41. The City restates and realleges those allegations set forth above in paragraphs 1-34 and incorporates the same as paragraphs 1 through 34 of this Count III.

42. The Licensee, on one or more occasions, caused or allowed the violation of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances, to wit: Chapter 666, section 666.01 entitled USE OF PREMISE TO DISTURB THE PEACE in that large rowdy mobs of patrons exited the Premises and engaged in disruptive behavior including fighting, loud yelling at late hours in a residential area, blocking traffic, and other such activities as to promote a breach of the peace and require large scale police responses from multiple police agencies to quell the disturbances. Said violations created an endangerment to the public and occurred on or about the following date(s): 04/19/26, 03/28/26, 01/10/26, 01/04/26.

COUNT IV
FALSE FIRE ALARM IN VIOLATION OF CHAPTER 666, SECTION 666.08 OF THE
CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN AND/OR 720 ILCS 5/26-
1(A)(2) OF THE ILLINOIS COMPILED STATUTES.

43. The City restates and realleges those allegations set forth above in paragraph 13 and incorporates the same as paragraph(s) 13 of this Count IV.
44. On or about March 15, 2026, police and fire department units responded to Mike's Place for a full fire alarm. Upon arrival, an investigation revealed that the Licensee caused or allowed person(s) inside the establishment to intentionally pull one of the alarm stations causing an emergency response to the location in violation of Chapter 666, Section 666.08 of the Berwyn Code of Ordinances entitled FALSE FIRE ALARM and/or 720 ILCS 5/26-1(A)(2) TRANSMITTING A FALSE FIRE ALARM. The aforesaid is a felony offense and created an endangerment to the public. Said violation occurred on or about the following date: *03/15/2026*.

COUNT V
BATTERY IN VIOLATION OF 720 ILCS 5/12-3 OF THE ILLINOIS COMPILED
STATUTES AND/OR CHAPTER 660, SECTION 660.01 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERWYN ENTITLED ASSAULTS.

45. The City restates and realleges those allegations set forth above in paragraphs 1-34 and incorporates the same as paragraphs 1 through 34 of this Count V.
46. The Licensee, on one or more occasions, caused or allowed behavior at the Premises that constituted a violation of 720 ILCS 5/12-3 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes entitled (BATTERY) and/or a violation of Chapter 660, Section 660.01 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Berwyn entitled ASSAULTS in that multiple physical altercations involving patrons of the Premises being unlawfully struck by other patrons at the establishment thereby creating a breach of law and an endangerment to the public. Said violations occurred on or about the following date(s): *05/23/2026, 04/17/2026, 03/29/2026, 02/07/2026, 01/18/2026, 01/14/2026, 11/29/2025, 07/30/2025*.

COUNT VI
AGGRAVATED ASSAULT AND UNLAWFUL USE OF A WEAPON (FIREARM) IN
VIOLATION OF THE ILLINOIS COMPILED STATUTES

46. The City restates and realleges those allegations set forth above in paragraphs 1-34 and incorporates the same as paragraphs 1 through 34 of this Count VI.
47. On one or more occasions, patrons of the Premises under the control of the Licensee have caused or allowed the violation of one or more sections of the Illinois Compiled Statutes, including, but not limited to 720 ILCS 5/24-1 in that they unlawfully threatened the use, possessed, displayed, or otherwise carried a loaded firearm thereby creating an imminent danger to the public. Said violations occurred on or about the following dates: *01/18/2026, 01/04/2026, 03/29/2025*

WHEREFORE, it is prayed that, based upon the above-referenced violation(s) relating to the Licensee, all City of Berwyn business and liquor licenses issued to the Licensee be suspended and/or revoked and/or remain revoked and not be renewed as any continued operation of the Licensee is so inimical to the public health, safety and general welfare of the City of Berwyn and its citizens, due to the multiple violations of Illinois Law and the Berwyn Code of Ordinances as set forth above which have taken place at the Premises, as to constitute a nuisance and serious danger of continuing harm to both prospective patrons of the establishment and the general public alike warranting the revocation and/or denial of applications for renewal of the business and liquor licenses relating to the Licensee.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that at the hearing you may be represented by counsel and may produce witnesses and introduce evidence on your behalf. **IN THE EVENT OF YOUR FAILURE TO APPEAR, A JUDGMENT OF DEFAULT MAY BE ENTERED AGAINST YOU.**
